#### **They Spent Much Time Together**

Change is rarely simple. As you know, Worship, Music and Arts team and the Council have been grappling with a plan for Sunday mornings in the year ahead. Lots of conversations have been held, many of you shared your thoughts on your experience of the single service this summer, pros and cons were considered, and a decision was made. As many of you know, we're going to continue with one worship service at 9:30 blending the worship styles of our previous two services. I'm proud of the prayerful consideration made by the WMA team and the Council.

Naturally this is disappointing to some of you. While the majority of the surveys were positive about our summer experiment, some expressed frustration with the changes or indicated that the new time presented challenges. Your leadership, both lay and staff, certainly understood these concerns and considered them.

But of course, there are also costs to keeping the two services and benefits to a single service. In the verses above from Luke's description of that post-Pentecost early church, there was a clear link between the wonders of God's grace and the depth of life in community. Witnessing the grace poured out in the ministry of those early apostles inspired the community to enter more deeply into relationship with God and one another. Hierarchies were torn down, priorities were changed, mutual caring and community building became the lynchpins of what it meant to be followers of Jesus.

I believe this new schedule affords us some opportunities to enter into deeper relationships with one another. While we all sacrifice a bit when it comes to service times and liturgical and musical preferences, we gain more diversity and community and we're stretched a bit in our experiences of worship. We're better able to welcome all that come through our doors and we can expand our Sunday morning offerings beyond worship.

I hope you have noticed that there are more children around Cross of Glory these days. We're discerning the best way to begin some nursery and Sunday school offerings once again. In addition to the various programs during the week, we'll offer adult forums all year at least twice a month while other Sundays preserve time for meetings and established small groups. We're building on the interest in occasional daytime offerings for our retired members and considering what else would be a blessing to this community.

As we begin this new program year, consider again how God might be calling you to share your gifts and passions with your friends and neighbors. Pray for the ministries of Cross of Glory and for the world with all its abundance and brokenness. Remind each other of how much you are loved and may awe come upon you as those believers of old at the wonders of God's love and mercy.


