A New Year Indeed

It's hard to believe we're just a few days away from 2019 already. Thanks to all of you who shared your gifts in so many ways for all the special events and worship services of Advent and Christmas Eve! Musicians and readers, decorators and bakers, planners and visitors, so many of you shared your gifts for the blessing of this community. A special word of thanks to Keith, Allan and Mark for the spectacular music throughout the season.

As you know, 2019 will bring some new blessings and opportunities for Cross of Glory. January 13 will be my last Sunday with you (I hear there will be a gathering afterwards, so I hope you will be able to join if you aren't already enjoying warmer weather somewhere). Even amidst excitement for new challenges, I'm sad to leave the ministry we have shared and am deeply grateful for all your support and partnership over these seven years.

The Spiritual gifts, services and activities the Apostle Paul wrote about in his letter to the Corinthians above have been abundant in this congregation through its more than 60 years. New gifts will again be called for in this year of transition. Already your elected leadership have worked with the Minneapolis Area Synod to find an Interim Pastor who will lead during the transition and search. Pastor Lee Hallstrom brings a wealth of experience as a pastor and specifically in interim work with congregations like Cross of Glory. Your support and partnership in ministry will be essential for his time with you just as it has been for mine.

As you may remember from previous transitions, the Call Committee will be the leadership team that guides you in the months ahead. Dan, Judy and the Council are already working to recruit a strong and diverse team. Once in place, the Call Committee will lead a process of discernment as you put together a ministry profile for Cross of Glory. This is a moment to prayerfully consider the unique gifts and challenges of Cross of Glory in this time and the direction you feel God calling you to go. It's not just about the next pastor you will call but also about what sort of ministries you feel drawn towards in the coming years. How is God calling Cross of Glory to be connected to this neighborhood, to the partner congregations of Wildfire, to the world? How will this building be used for the good of the community? What new ministry is God calling you to pursue with passion and resources? Is it time to consider prioritizing the calling of a woman or a pastor of color as the new lead pastor of Cross of Glory? These and other questions are as important for you to consider as for your new pastor.

Once you have created a ministry profile for Cross of Glory, the Call Committee will indicate to the Bishop and the Synod staff that they are ready to receive candidates that are potential matches for this ministry. Your call committee will work with their profiles and narrow in on a set of candidates to interview, finally determining a pastor to recommend to the full congregation for call. This process will likely take at least six to nine months, though no timeline is predetermined.

While I know this time can be marked by some anxiety about the future, it can also be an exciting time of new energy and relationships. God is faithful and is always at work making all things new! Trust in the Spirit, support your leaders, pray constantly and continue to love one another well. My prayers will be with you and I look forward to where God will lead Cross of Glory in the years ahead.
