I appreciate these words from medieval thinker, writer and teacher Meister Eckhart because they speak of the importance of gratitude in our lives. It is so easy, isn't it, to dwell on what we don't have, what has changed, what is wrong in the world or in others and on what is lacking. When we do this, however, we miss out on all that is right in the world and in others, all that we do have, all that God has done and continues to do in our lives. The Bible continually calls us back to gratitude as a foundation for healthy living.

Recently, in a Tuesday morning Scripture Study here at Cross of Glory, we were reflecting on the Psalm for the upcoming Sunday, Psalm 103:1-8. Here the psalmist burst forth in praise and thanks to God with these words: "Bless the Lord, O my soul and all that is within me, bless his holy name." As we talked about the importance of gratitude in our lives and how we all at times fail to have a grateful and thankful spirit, someone in the group shared this poignant saying: "What if you woke up tomorrow with only the things you thanked God for today." How true! Gratitude for what we DO HAVE, and all that God is and has done for us, is vital for our spiritual, physical and emotional well-being.

Having been your interim pastor for the past seven months, I can identify several reasons to thank and praise God here at Cross of Glory:

-for so many people who in the senior citizen years of their lives still have a desire to make a difference for God and others

-for the gifts and abilities that are abundant in this congregationregardless of age

- -for a congregation that seeks to welcome others and to grow in this area
- -for being a community of faith that prays for others and is concerned about those who are sick, home bound or hurting
 - -for a gracious and warm spirit that is prevalent in so many
- -for an appreciation of good music and of worship that is done to the glory of God
- -for the gift of a very worshipful sanctuary and of ample building space with which to reach out and to share with others
- -for the blessing of good and faithful staff people and congregational leaders
 - -for a very visible location on Brooklyn Blvd.

I see much here at Cross of Glory for which to offer thanks and praise to God. I know that in several ways, things aren't the way they were in the past when you had 3500 members, the largest Sunday School in the ALC, the Bethel room was packed with children and you had several worship services on a Sunday morning. However, there is still so much here!


