## NARRATION

**Reader #1:** This child was born before we had anything to offer him, before we lifted our voices in praise or our hands to His work, before we even thought to worship Him—in fact, even before we were ever created, God was pursuing us out of love.

## NARRATION

**Reader #1:** Christ's humble beginnings made him accessible. Going into a throne room to see a king would be intimidating, but there's nothing intimidating about going into a stable and approaching a feeding trough. You don't need special credentials; you don't need to have an appointment. The shepherds could just come in.

**Reader #2:** In fact, an angel appeared to that group of shepherds and told them exactly how to find this tiny baby. They were given this good news by an amazing assembly of heavenly beings in order to seek him out.

**Reader #3:** Once the host of angels left, the shepherds knew what they had to do. They said, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." And they hurried to see Jesus.

**Reader #4:** My friends, the message of the season is not, "Let it snow" or "Let us shop." The message of Christmas is, "Come! Let us worship." And "Let there be God's peace in the world." That is why the shepherds went with haste and excitement...to share and live out the good news of God's love; that is what we are called and compelled to do too.

## GOSPEL READING

**Matthew 1:18-24**

**Pastor:** The Gospel according to Matthew, the first chapter.

**All:** Glory to you O Lord.

This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly. But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us"). When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.

**Pastor:** This is the Gospel of our Lord.

**Reader #4:** On that night, as foretold by the prophets, God sent a Savior. He was born to a young girl of no status or wealth. He was wrapped in rags, given from the heart of God. The perfect gift. God gave us Jesus to bring us hope. God, in love, gave us Jesus to be with us.
