Throughout Cross of Glory's history, the front doors of the church have been pushed and propped open for many. Thanks to your generosity, the doors of 5929 Brooklyn Blvd now open even more widely, and certainly a bit more easily. This spring, we set out to raise funds to make the front doors more accessible for those who use wheelchairs and walkers, those pushing strollers and grocery carts, those carrying heavy loads--whether figuratively or literally. We not only met but surpassed our fundraising goal, such that we were able to install automatic openers to our main restroom doors too. Thanks again to all who so generously contributed toward ensuring that our facilities reflect part of our Everyday Liturgy of "embodying God's hospitality!" I want to share a few of the ways I've already seen these doors open in recent days. I've seen them open for the congregations who worship here: Cross of Glory, Faith Healing International Ministries, and Messiah's Messengers 7th Day Adventists. I've seen them open for a couple hundred people at the end of last month, when the Fellowship Hall was used for an Isaiah meeting, a gathering of interfaith leaders who were discussing the need for increased access to affordable childcare, housing, and healthcare in the northwest metro area. I've seen the doors open for the Cross Community Players, the local theater group who met in the building last month for rehearsals and performances of "Hello Dolly." I've seen them open for those who have come in to fix something in the building that's broken, or those who are working to beautify the land surrounding the building or grow vegetables in our community gardens. I've seen the doors open for Progeny students and staff who are meeting for summer school. I've seen the open for a gathering of pastors of the eight Wildfire churches with whom we're in partnership. I've seen them open for the Community Quilters lugging scraps of fabric that will be transformed into gorgeous guilts and donated to neighbors through CEAP. I've seen the doors open for people coming to plan the funeral of a loved one, and for kids signing up for Vacation Bible School. I've seen the doors open for a neighbor who simply needed to come

rest and cool off for a while on a hot day.

Even as we continue to discern new possibilities for how our facilities may be shared in the future, these doors have already empowered us to share the space in powerful ways for the sake of life together here. It's been a joy to witness the ways you've helped make sure that they swing open wide for all who come in through them--and all who are sent forth out of them--to share God's gift of life together! -Pastor Ali

Council Meeting Notes Following the call to order and our opening prayer, the council approved the previous month's council meeting minutes, the treasurers report and the pastor's report. New council meeting minutes, the treasurers report and work of the 5929 Facilities Task Force, which has been meeting since May 15th. Once again, the purpose of the Task Force is to explore the possibilities for space usage at CoG.

Building and Grounds report as follows:

- lift repair, latching mechanism; parts on order
- Bethel room floor, flood damage; needs repair. Fixing sinks & toilets downstairs as well
- A/C in Progeny Academy lower level classroom; AC unit purchased, need install
- kitchen freezer replacement; likely in July
- Progeny break room kitchen water heater; checking cost
- kitchen water softener; checking cost
- kitchen dishwasher cleaning needed due to hard water issues
- fire department hook-up (hydrostatic) was completed and passed inspection 6/24/2024
- Faith Healing office moving to Bethel room office

Embodying God's Hospitality Campaign: \$20,890 raised, which exceeds our original \$15,000 goal. Door openers installed working (women's restroom need minimal update)

Land north of the church building; In conversation with the city of Brooklyn Center regarding maintenance of the land approaching Admiral Lane. More information will be coming.

Deferred Maintenance Assessment (audit); In connection with the work of our 5929 Task Force, the church council has approved the need for a consultant to audit our building and property (an estimate of what work/improvements and/or up-dates are immediately necessary, or in the near future).

Summer 2024 "After certainty: A biblical guide" by the Rev. Dr. Meghan Johnston Aelabouni

A global pandemic, political upheaval, a changing climate... these days, the future is more uncertain than it has ever been. Or is it? For the people of the Bible, life was often shaped by deep uncertainty. Encounters with God sparked awe, confusion or courage, but rarely certainty. Instead, God's people have always been called to follow God into the unknown, trusting in God's certain grace and love. This three-session summer Bible study explores God's invitation to the people of the Bible and to us, to take the holy journey beyond certainty to curiosity, community and compassion, where we find abundant life in Christ.

July 2024 After certainty: Community

When certainty in faith becomes the responsibility of the individual, this can isolate us from God and from community. The reformer Martin Luther's own failures of certainty led him to return to passages in the gospels and epistles that proclaimed salvation, not as a reward for our certainty, but as a gift granted in and through community. In this second session, we consider how some of the pivotal texts of the Lutheran Reformation changed the church and the world.

August 2024 After certainty: Compassion

When certainty becomes judamentalism, it contributes to divisions between people and within communities. The teachings of Jesus and the pastoral writings of the apostle Paul sometimes urge people to choose compassion over correctness—a model that can offer Christians guidance in a polarized time.



CALLED TO LIFE TOGETHER: AN EVERYDAY LITURGY

The word liturgy means "the work of the people." We believe that we are called not only to share in the liturgy of worship on Sunday mornings-rooted in the rhythms of Gathering, Word, Table, and Sending-but also to a liturgy that is lived out the rest of the week, in and with the broader Brooklyn Center community. Therefore, this Everyday Liturgy seeks to express the work that we, the people of Cross of Glory, are called and committed to in our everyday lives (from Sunday afternoons through Saturday nights!) in light of being called to life together.

GATHERING - We are called to embody God's hospitality by generously sharing space, time, gifts, and resources, and by meeting neighbors on their terms and for their sake-open to what we can both give and receive.


WORD - We are called to listen and look for the ways that God's love is alive, both within the church and throughout the wider neighborhood, especially where the Gospel tells us it's often found: in the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick, the imprisoned.
