## **REST AND WORK, WORK AND REST**

We're now entering into the summer months, and we're beginning to see the fruit of the seeds that have been planted in the soil earlier this spring--to see the "work that darkness does," as Wendell Berry puts it in his quote on the cover. And with this summer season that the earth has entered into, we too enter into new rhythms. Summer seems to be a time that dances between rest and work, work and rest, and that is true for us here at church as well.

This month, the lectionary has us exploring stories in worship about both rest and work. On June 2, for example, we read about the ways that the ancient Jewish practice of observing the sabbath invites us to rest, and in so doing, discover again the gifts of healing, delight, gratitude, and our interdependency with all living things. On June 16, we read the parable of the mustard seed, which invites us into the work of opening our arms like branches, where God's creatures can find shelter and sanctuary.

In the pages of this newsletter, there are various invitations into rest: breaks from regular programming, ways to share food and fellowship, listen to live music together in our city's parks, or catch a baseball aame with our fellow Wildfire churches.

There are also invitations and reflections on the work we're called to continue: discerning what God's call to life together means for our space usage via the 5929 Facilities Task Force, gardening, the work of liturgy--both on Sunday mornings as well our Everyday Liturgy that guides us in doing "the work of the people" the rest of the week...

I look forward to entering into these rhythms together with you this month, living in hope as God brings new life about in the seeds that have been planted in the ground, and indeed all around us. -Pastor Ali



#### CALLED TO LIFE TOGETHER: AN EVERYDAY LITURGY

The word liturgy means "the work of the people." We believe that we are called not only to share in the liturgy of worship on Sunday mornings-rooted in the rhythms of Gathering, Word, Table, and Sending-but also to a liturgy that is lived out the rest of the week, in and with the broader Brooklyn Center community. Therefore, this Everyday Liturgy seeks to express the work that we, the people of Cross of Glory, are called and committed to in our everyday lives (from Sunday afternoons through Saturday nights!) in light of being called to life together.

GATHERING - We are called to embody God's hospitality by generously sharing space, time, gifts, and resources, and by meeting neighbors on their terms and for their sake-open to what we can both give and receive.

WORD - We are called to listen and look for the ways that God's love is alive, both within the church and throughout the wider neighborhood, especially where the Gospel tells us it's often found: in the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick, the imprisoned.

TABLE - We are called to lament the sin and suffering of ourselves, our neighbors, and the earth, as embodied by Jesus on the cross. And we are called to celebrate God's gift of life (together), as embodied by the resurrected Jesus. We believe that lament and celebration often happens most powerfully at tables, where bread is broken and shared.

SENDING - We are called to work for a just community, care for neighbors in body, mind, and spirit, and tend to the earth's gifts with humility and love.

•Gardens - Thanks to all those who have helped take part in tending the gardens and grounds at CoG as we've begun this holy season of growing! We've got fruit trees, pollinators, veggies, & flowers beginning to grow all over the place. The neighborhood bees, butterflies, and birds are already enjoying them...we look forward to sharing them with you too on our Garden Harvest table in a handful of weeks when they're bloomed and ripe!

•Plot of land north of church - The City of Brooklyn Center has recently followed up with Cross of Glory about landscaping and maintenance plans for portions of city-owned land around the church affected by the Brooklyn Blvd redevelopment project where sod was originally planted but didn't establish due to drought conditions last year. More details to come soon.

•Raised garden bed - Cross of Glory is grateful to have been

included in a City of Brooklyn Center grant through Hennepin County, through which we were gifted a new raised garden bed. We look forward to it being installed this summer as part of our community gardens on the corner of Admiral and Ewing when the grant goes into effect.

The final event has taken place & the numbers have been tallied. With the help of Wendy & Brenda, you ordered the yummy rolls and ordered plants from Gertens. You purchased raffle tickets for donated auilts, embroidered towels and vendor items. You & friends of Cross of Glory donated homemade items to be purchased. You gave directly towards camp scholarships. YOU MADE A DIFFERENCE!!

As we booked our week at camp and got ready for registration, the hope for our youth attending weeklong camp was Cross of Glory would contribute 1/3 of the cost (\$200), kids would fundraise 1/3 of camp (\$200) and parents would pay the balance (\$250). BUT..... due to your support and generosity, fundraising numbers exceeded our goal! As a result, we were able to do two things:

Pay for the registration of our three kids attending one day camp! I'm especially excited about this as it's a wonderful way for our youngest kids to get out a taste of what being at bible camp is like and get them excited to one day attend weeklong camp. GREATLY reduced the parent portion responsibility to send their child(ren) to camp. It costs \$650 for each youth attending weeklong camp. While that is a bargain for meals, lodging & all activities happening throughout the week, it can stretch a family financially, especially when you are sending multiple kids to camp.

When Rachel Kurtz led us musically a few weeks ago in worship, I was reminded of a song she wrote & sang for the National Youth Gathering held in New Orleans in 2012. This song was sung at our opening & closing large group worship gatherings. It was entitled "Make a Difference". The words I want to share with you today are from the chorus, which spoke to me about how I wanted to live life as a Christian. They are:

I want my life to make a difference; I want my life to make a change. I want my life to do some good here; I want my life to make a change.

That is what YOU all have done! With your continued commitment to the youngest in our Cross of Glory community, you have made a difference! You have made a change! You have done good! I'm so grateful for each one of you, your generous hearts, supporting our youth and for loving like Jesus.

## Summer 2024 "After certainty: A biblical guide" by the Rev. Dr. Meghan Johnston Aelabouni

A global pandemic, political upheaval, a changing climate... these days, the future is more uncertain than it has ever been. Or is it? For the people of the Bible, life was often shaped by deep uncertainty. Encounters with God sparked awe, confusion or courage, but rarely certainty. Instead, God's people have always been called to follow God into the unknown, trusting in God's certain grace and love. This three-session summer Bible study explores God's invitation to the people of the Bible and to us, to take the holy journey beyond certainty to curiosity, community and compassion, where we find abundant life in Christ.

## May/June 2024 issue After certainty: Curiosity

Jesus' ministry, during the uncertainty of the first century Roman occupation, often challenged the "certainties" of the status quo when it came to faith, power and relationships—both the relationships between people and God, and between people in community. Just as curiosity drew people to Jesus and his message, holy curiosity can still lead us to the places where God transforms "what is" to "what could be."

#### July 2024 After certainty: Community

When certainty in faith becomes the responsibility of the individual, this can isolate us from God and from community. The reformer Martin Luther's own failures of certainty led him to return to passages in the gospels and epistles that proclaimed salvation, not as a reward for our certainty, but as a gift granted in and through community. In this second session, we consider how some of the pivotal texts of the Lutheran Reformation changed the church and the world.
