"YOUR DEEP GLADNESS. THE WORLD'S DEEP HUNGER."


A few Sundays ago, thanks to the leadership of Barbara Sahr, we gathered for a special Sunday worship service celebrating "God's Work Our Hands." Children sang and played instruments. New voices prayed prayers and led the liturgy. One of our youth members became an usher. Members of Cross of Glory and Faith Healing cooked potluck dishes. The community gardeners shared fresh veggies from the garden in the church's backyard. People signed up to take part in ministries ranging from serving communion on Sunday mornings to tutoring on Wednesday nights. Families made cards for students at Progeny as they begin the new school year. It was a full--and joy-ful--morning!

As we continue to discern ways we're called to do God's work, I encourage you to continue reflecting on the quote shared that morning from Frederick Buechner: "The place God calls you is where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet." Or as the image on the cover of our newsletter puts it: "...where your greatest joy meets the world's great need." In other words, the work God calls us to is the intersection of our gladness, our joy, our gifts, the stuff we're good at, the stuff we love, *and* the stuff that the world around us needs of us, the deep hunger of our neighbors.

As I'd said that Sunday, it's easy to err on one side or the other of what Buechner's talking about. On the one hand, we may be engaged in work that addresses the needs of the community or world, but isn't work that gives us life (admittedly, there'is plenty of church work that may not be particularly life-giving but still needs doing!). But if this is the *only* work we're doing--work that's needed but that we don't find gladness in--then, according to Buechner, we've missed something about God's call. On the other hand, if the only work we are doing is work we enjoy, work that we want to do, but that doesn't address the very concrete and ever-changing needs of our neighbors, then we've also missed the point.

So, as Buechner says, the work God calls us to often is where these two axes meet--where gladness and hunger are in conversation. What does that intersection look like for you? Or to use the language of our service a few weeks ago, what is the work you are called to do with your hands?

Part of *my* own gladness is getting to discern these vocational questions with you. If you want to get together to explore how God might be calling you this year--at Cross of Glory or in our Brooklyn Center neighborhood--please reach out! I'd love to meet for a walk, a cup of coffee, or a home visit. We also have an "Our Hands" form available (copies located on the bulletin boards near the sanctuary) that we invite everyone to fill out that helps us locate those intersections of gladness and hunger joy and need. As we explore our vocations, both individually and as a church community, I give thanks for the gift of sharing in God's work together with you, Pastor Ali

ALL SAINTS SUNDAY


